Person-to-Person (P2P) is a community-supported non-profit organization that provides emergency assistance for basic needs and support for individuals and families as they move towards stability.

The *Pre-Pandemic* Need

The high cost of living in the Norwalk-Stamford metropolitan area makes it difficult for many people to afford basic needs.

The cost of living in Stamford/Norwalk is \$62,151 (MIT Living Wage Calculator), yet on a recent client survey 80% of P2P clients reported annual income of \$28,529 or less

20% percent more expensive in the Stamford/Norwalk metropolitan area than the national average

With more than half the school-aged population eligible for free or reduced-price lunch, the need is deep and real.

For families earning a minimum wage, two wage earners each need two full-time jobs to earn enough to support their family

40% of Americans are only one paycheck away from poverty

With volunteer support in three food pantries and a Clothing Center, P2P improves financial stability, reduces stress, enhances school performance and helps prevent chronic disease.

- Feeding 3,000 households per month
- 700,000 meals since January (1.2M meals in 2019)



Safely Meeting Community Needs

COVID 19: Meeting Critical Needs

P2P faced dramatic increases in need overnight due to the COVID-19 pandemic:

- Record unemployment, including 10,000 claims filed in one day alone, and topping the height of the Great Recession, overwhelmed systems leading to long delays in processing times and many left with no income
- Fairfield County “hotspot” of infections meant many were unable to work or leave their homes to seek assistance
- Half of Connecticut’s undocumented immigrants reside in Fairfield County and are ineligible for State and Federal stimulus payments, SNAP or other forms of assistance, leaving them vulnerable and in need of food assistance



The Uneven Effects of the Pandemic

COVID 19: Meeting Critical Needs

Not all are suffering equally:

- African Americans have worse health outcomes from COVID-19, primarily due to SDOH and employment status
 - 2.5X more likely to die
- Some incomes have increased. Stimulus payments of up to \$1,200 per person helped. The \$600 extra unemployment payments are set to expire at the end of July
- The number of people reporting they “sometimes” or “often” do not have enough to eat has increased 2% nationally to include 4M people, but **20%** of African American people now report being food insecure
- Moratoriums on evictions have been extended until late August
- Remote learning has impacted low-income children to a greater extent; 1 in 25 students participated in no school at all during the pandemic



Rising to the Challenge

COVID 19: Operational Response to the Crisis

- P2P is designated an “essential” workplace, operating its food pantry and emergency financial assistance programs throughout the crisis
- Over 90% of volunteers forced to stay home due to age, health, vulnerability to the virus or the need to care for others, including children
- Client interactions moved to “contactless” – substituting phone calls for in-person meetings, curbside pick-up for self-select food distribution and creative solutions to reaching vulnerable populations
- National disruptions to food supply chains and the loss of food drive donations forced food pantries including P2P to scramble to purchase food at significant cost



Total Clients Served by Site




Food Clients Served by Site

Successfully Meeting Record Demand

COVID 19: Meeting Dramatic Increases in Critical Needs

- In May 2020, P2P provided 60% more food than before the pandemic and 90% more food than the prior year
- In May 2020, P2P provided 380% more emergency financial assistance for rent than the prior year
- In 2020 – 2021, P2P expects to provide almost \$1M in emergency financial assistance
- One third of those seeking assistance had never been to P2P before
- Feeding almost 9,000 individuals per month



Door2Door

COVID 19: Home Delivery Service Launched


- P2P launched a new program, Door2Door, to provide home delivery of food to those affected by COVID-19
- Over 3,500 individuals received home delivery of food at no cost to them
- Volunteer drivers make deliveries to residents in need in the 7 towns served by P2P (Darien, New Canaan, Norwalk, Stamford, Weston, Westport and Wilton)



Community Support

COVID 19: Innovation in the Face of Increased Needs

- Online “virtual” food drive generated over 400 gifts and raised over \$150,00 for the purchase of food
- Drive-thru contactless food drives made up for the loss of traditional drives, generating over 10,000 pounds of food
- Community volunteers donated hundreds of face masks for volunteers, staff and clients
- Opus for Person-to-Person matching grant raised \$200,000 for Balloons for Families campaign
